

Welcome to the 2023 InfoSoup Library Road Trip!

You are welcome to join a 10 week trip to visit 49 library locations throughout 10 counties in Northeast Wisconsin. You will discover the unique buildings, services, and resources available in these communities.

How to Participate

- 1. Your road trip begins by picking up a map booklet at any participating InfoSoup library. Use this booklet to plan your road trip to as many of our 49 InfoSoup library locations as you can visit. You can also download a map at: infosoup.info/roadtrip. Maps can be stamped from May 1, 2023 until July 15, 2023.
- 2. There are two ways that you can get your map stamped.
 - Visit a participating InfoSoup library and do one of the following: check out an item, participate in a program or activity, or sign-up to use a public computer. (Perfect to plan your next road trip stop!)
 - Can't travel? Call an InfoSoup library and ask the librarian for a book or movie recommendation, or ask a question about the library or the community. You will get a secret code to add to your map. Please don't share your code.
- 3. Only one stamp or code per patron per library.
- For every ten stamps or codes you collect, go to an InfoSoup member library and get an entry form for a chance to win prizes. You may enter up to four times.
- 5. The prize drawing will occur on August 1, 2023. Winners will be notified using the contact information on their entry form. Staff of the participating InfoSoup libraries are not eligible to win.



Coleman-Pound Library

Goodman Library

1 Falcon Crest (inside Goodman Public High School) Goodman, WI 54125 marinettecountylibraries.org | 715-251-3236 The Town of Goodman originated in 1908 as a logging community founded by the Goodman family.



Stephenson Public Library (Marinette)

Marinette, WI 54143 marinettecountylibraries.org | 715-732-7570 Explore nearby waterfalls or tour the city's many shops and try out a classic Wisconsin supper club in Marinette.

Peshtigo Library

331 French St. Ste. B Peshtigo, WI 54157 marinettecountylibraries.org | 715-582-4905 Peshtigo is historically known as "The City Rebuilt from Ashes," as it had the worst recorded forest fire in North America.

Gillett Public Library

200 E. Main St. Gillett, WI 54124 gilpubliclibrary.org | 920-855-6224 With a population of 1282, Gillett is a small city, but offers many services that you find in larger cities.



Lakes Country Public Library

Lakewood, WI 54138 lakescountrylibrary.org | 715-276-9020 Located in in the heart of the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest, Lakewood is a fresh breath of Northern Wisconsin air.



Lena Public Library

Black Creek Village Library

507 S. Maple St. Black Creek, WI 54106 blackcreeklibrary.org | 920-984-3094 Black Creek was initially known as Middleburg due to its proximity to Green Bay, Appleton and Shawano.



Hortonville Public Library

531 N. Nash St. Hortonville, WI 54944 hortonvillelibrary.org | 920-779-4279 The area now occupied by the Village of Hortonville was once home to the Sac, Fox and Ho-Chunk peoples.



Kaukauna Public Library

207 Thilmany Rd. Suite 200 Kaukauna, WI 54130 kaukaunalibrary.org | 920-766-6340 The library had the first private lending collection in the 1880's and is located in historic Thilmany Eagle Mill.



Kimberly Public Library

515 W. Kimberly Ave. Kimberly, WI 54136 kimberlypubliclibrary.org | 920-788-7515 Kimberly was known as The Cedars, then as Smithfield before it was renamed after one of the founders of Kimberly-Clark Corporation in 1889.

Little Chute Public Library

625 Grand Ave. Little Chute, WI 54140 littlechutelibrary.org | 920-788-7825 You can watch over 150 years of Dutch histor come to life at the Little Chute Windmill which stands over 100 feet tall.

Muehl Public Library (Seymour)

436 N. Main St. Sevmour, WI 54165 muehlpubliclibrary.org | 920-833-2725 The annual Burger-Fest takes place the first week of August and celebrates Seymour as "the home of the hamburger."



W7740 Pine St. Shiocton, WI 54170 shioctonlibrary.org | 920-986-3933 Shiocton draws large crowds every year to witness the sturgeon spawn along the banks of the Wolf River in April.



Shawano County Libraries

Birnamwood Branch Library 337 Main St.

Birnamwood, WI 54414 shawanolibrary.org | 715-449-2576 Birnamwood is traversed from top to bottom by the Middle Branch of the Embarass River.



Bonduel Branch Library

125 N. Washington St. Bonduel, WI 54107 shawanolibrary.org | 715-758-2267 The Village of Bonduel was named after the Reverend F. Bonduel, who founded the Catholic mission at Keshena in 1853.



Mattoon Branch Library

311 Slate Ave. Mattoon, WI 54450 shawanolibrary.org | 715-489-3333 Mattoon, WI was named after George B. Mattoon, an early Wisconsin lumberman.

Shawano Main Library

128 S. Sawyer St. Shawano, WI 54166 shawanolibrary.org | 715-526-3829 This city is home to the Wolf River, and Shawano Lake is located just at the edge of city limits.



Tigerton Branch Library

221 Birch St. Tigerton, WI 54486 shawanolibrary.org | 715-535-2194 Tigerton is named after Tiger Creek which is said to have fast moving waters that roar like a tiger.



Wittenberg Branch Library

302 S. Cherry St. Wittenberg, WI 54499 shawanolibrary.org | 715-253-2936 Make sure to check out the Walls of Wittenberg (WOW) mural display and Art Park in downtown.

Neuschafer Community Library (Fremont)

317 Wolf River Drive Fremont, WI 54940 fremontpl.org | 920-446-2474 Fremont has been referred to as the "White Bass Capital of the World" and is situated on the beautiful Wolf River.



Iola Village Library

180 S. Main St. Iola, WI 54945 iolalibrary.org | 715-445-4330 lola is known for hosting the annual Iola Old Car Show with over 120,000 attendees and 2,500 cars on display.
